On the Air Waves

'End Play' Helped Expert Win Master Championship

This is the third of a series of end plays taken from the master championship tournaments played recently in New York. Today's hand came from A. Goldstein of Brooklyn, N. Y., winner of the senior masters national individual tournament. As I have told you, end plays are an important part of the bag of tricks of every good player, and it was an end play that helped Goldstein make his contract on today's hand. East opened the king of hearts and continued with hearts, Goldstein (North) refusing to win until the third round. Two small spades were discarded from dummy. A small club was won in dummy with the king and a club returned in the hope of breaking the club suit. But East showed out, discarding a spade. Goldstein won the trick with the ace, led a small diamond which he returned in dummy with the queen, returning the king of diamonds. East dropped the jack. Goldstein then led the queen of clubs and East let go another spade. Now East was practically marked with the king and two spades and two good hearts, so Goldstein returned the nine of diamonds to his ace and East dropped the ten of spades. The king of hearts was then played, throwing East in the lead with the nine. East cashed the good three of hearts, but was forced then to lead from the king-jack of spades into declarer's ace-queen - and three no trump was made.

Zone Ordinance Revise Approved

Final reading and adoption have been given by the City Council to an amendment to the zoning ordinance to reclassify a triangular-shaped tract in the northwesterly section of Long Beach, west of Los Angeles River channel, mostly to single-family homes. This area is from the alley east of Long Beach Blvd. and Pico Ave. and south of the alley south of Artesia St. The change in zoning is from R-2, two-family, and R-4, multiple-family, to R-1. A small area north of Coolidge St. and east of the boulevard will be rezoned from R-2 to public and semipublic use districts. According to the Planning Commission, which instituted the rezoning, practically all the improvements within the area are single-family dwellings, and it was found that few residents knew that any other type of structure could be built there.

Divorce Law Eased

WASHINGTON, March 15. (AP) The House public lands committee has approved a bill which would cut residence requirements for seeking a divorce in Hawaii to one year. Present law requires a two-year residence.
