**RANDOLPH A.F.B. STARTS
JET ENGINE INSTRUCTION**

Instructions in the operations of jet engines now being used in the F-81 jet fighters has begun at Randolph Air Force Base, authorities at the pilot training center report.

The new training aid being used in the instruction consists of a cut-away J-35-A-15 turbo-jet engine recently received at the academic department where it is included in student class work of the aircraft engineering courses.

The huge engine, 40 inches in diameter, designed by General Electric and built by the Ellington division of General Motors, measures nine and a half feet without the exhaust cone, and 14 1/2 with it.

The engine operates by ejecting a volume of expanding gas from a single orifice at the rear, the propelling thrust being derived from the weight and velocity of the gas as it leaves the exhaust cone produced by eight combustion chambers.

The output is rated in pounds of thrust rather than horsepower. The engine is capable of turning up 7,700 revolutions per minute with a thrust of 3,700.

**Stephen F. Austin Letter
On Display at Bank Here**

Now on display at the First National Bank is the third of a series of significant documents from Texas history, an enlarged reproduction of a letter written by Stephen F. Austin urging that no harsh treatment be accorded Santa Anna while a prisoner.

After the battle of San Jacinto which resulted in Santa Anna's capture, there was naturally much anger and resentment. A large part of the Army and some of the prominent citizens of the time felt that Santa Anna had forfeited his life and should be executed.

Opposed to this view were such farseeing leaders as Burnet, Austin and Houston. These men knew the precarious footing which the newly born republic was on, diplomatically. They realized that harsh treatment accorded Santa Anna

might cause an unfavorable reaction among other nations.
Austin's letter will remain on display in a case just outside the door of the bank through April 2.
