'Speechless' Star Linguist Learns Fifth Language

Overwhelmed by the gracious tribute paid her by a foreign government at a dinner in Hollywood recently, Allied Artists star Florence Marly, in accepting a silver medal, said, "I am speechless—in four languages." Six months from now, at a similar event, she might say, "I am speechless—in five languages." The Lithian-haired French actress, soon to make her Allied Artists debut in "Maid For a Man," is not satisfied with being able to speak fluently in four languages. So she's studying a fifth—Chinese. Asked why she selected that language, she said, "Because one day I want to visit China, and I think the least one may do when one visits a foreign country is to speak the native language. It is a compliment to the people of the country." That night when, with Rod Cameron, Reno Browne, Vincent Price, Barbara Britton and Mary Grant, she was honored by the Peruvian government for strengthening goodwill between this country and Peru during a visit to Lima last December, Miss Marly might have told her auditors that she is "an actress in four languages." She has made pictures in Czech, French, Spanish and English.

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Bid Can Be Made on Tricky Hand by Counting Tricks

Today's hand is a little tricky, up the fourth diamond, so you but it is one you would get a cash the ace and king of diamonds, but when West drops the queen, you are warned of the bad break. You also should know that West probably held only two hearts to start with, so now lead the five of hearts and win in the five of spades and lead the seven, throwing West in the lead. West has nothing but clubs, so he has to lead one of them into your ace-queen. Thus you make two clubs, two diamonds, two hearts and three spades—just what you had counted on. If you win the first spade trick with the king, how can you make three spade tricks? You must go up with dummy's ace of spades at trick one, even though it costs you the singleton king, and immediately return the jack of spades. West will not win this trick, so
