Long Saturday Night Air Show Already Big Hit. By C. E. BUTTERFIELD. NEW YORK. (AP) Saturday Night Review, the expensive show N. B. C. has set up to help enliven the television week end and attract sponsors, already has established itself. Only five weeks along in the first 13-week cycle, plans for the 2 1/2-hour presentation divided between the shows of Jack Carter and Sid Caesar, provide for its continuation right through the summer without vacation except for the principals. So far only three sponsors out of a possible 15 have been incorporated into the program, but it is expected others will join in the spring or next fall. From a purely dollar and cents standpoint, the income to date has not any where equalled the \$50,000 per week outgo, but the network has given every indication it is fairly well satisfied with results. These have included high viewer ratings and lots of plaudits from the critics. There's been a further development in the matter of feminine necklines in television. It is contained in this quotation from one network: "Leave It to the Girls" has received a large number of comments regarding low necklines. N. B. C. concurred with the opinions of the viewers and as a result has advised the staff of "Leave It to the Girls" to make sure that girls on the panel have reasonably modest necklines. That would seem to be at least one answer to the question "how low should TV necklines be?"
