French Air Show Record Made on Radio Tonight

The Long Beach Barbershop Quartette, "The Four Bits of Harmony," has transcribed a fifteen-minute program of five songs to be broadcast over the French Broadcasting System. FM radio station KNOB is one of 200 member stations in the United States belonging to the International Goodwill Network operating in 25 countries, and broadcasts two weekly programs transcribed in Paris. In exchange for these transcriptions, the local station is sending the quartette program to France as an example of an American style of music.
Two members of the Four Bits of Harmony are Bill Lardabal, Chuck Hooper, Dick Montgomery and Don Nunes. During the past year, the quartette has become popular in this area and will be a favorite in the contest to be held April 22, in the Municipal Auditorium, sponsored by the Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barber-shop Quartette Singing in America, Inc.
Marcel S. Malville of Long Beach, announced the locally transmitted program in French. He explained the history of barbershop quartette singing and made complimentary references to Long Beach. Before shipping the transcription to France, KNOB will broadcast it at 7:30 p. m. tonight.
