North Ireland's Premier Delays Visit to America

LONDON—(U.P.)—Sir Basil Brooke, prime minister of Northern Ireland, postponed his scheduled visit to the United States at the last moment Friday.

It was reported that the British government requested the post-ponement because the American house of representatives voted to cut off Marshall plan aid to Great Britain unless Northern Ireland was joined with the southern state of Erie.

Brooke said in a statement that he postponed his departure "for purely personal reasons" and that he would fly to New York in time to keep his first American speaking engagement before the National Press club in Washington April 6.

He said also that he had not been in contact with British officials.

But well-informed quarters reported that Britain suggested that he wait a while in the expectation that the house of representatives vote would be reversed. (The vote was reversed late Friday.)

Minocqua Man Charged With Murder Try Dies

TOMAHAWK—(A)—William R. Osborne, 42, of Minocqua, awaiting trial on a charge of attempting to murder his wife, died in a hospital here Friday afternoon of injuries suffered in an automobile crash.
