## Defense Must Use Teamwork Play to Defeat Declarer

Good defensive play often and South the last three tricks, requires teamwork. No matter which, with the heart ace won on how well you lay your plans, if the first trick, would defeat the contract.

North's natural opening against the four-spade contract on today's hand was the 10 of hearts, the top of his partner's suit. South went up with the ace and immediately led the seven of spades to stop the declarer from getting a heart ruff. West won this trick in dummy and led the king of clubs. When South did not place the ace, declarer trumped with the four of spades. Now West ran off six spade tricks, and this left him with the king and eight of hearts and the eight and deuce of diamonds. Dummy was left with the king, jack and 10 of diamonds and the queen-jack of hearts and ace-queen of diamonds. So all the declarer had to do was cash
