WHILE it is true that you cannot always count on players at the table bidding their hands correctly, nevertheless there are certain sound principles which few players disregard.

Mr. Bertram H. Tolley, who is in the fuel business in Richmond Hill, N. Y., sent me today's very well-played hand. He had to analyze the bidding and watch the drop of the cards. First of all the spade overcall on the part of East warned Mr. Tolley that he must have the king of clubs. Now watch Mr. Tolley's deduction in the play of the cards.

Mr. Tolley, sitting North, won trumped in dummy with a small diamond, West's jack dropping. Now the losing heart in dummy could be discarded on the good nine of clubs and the contract made.
