Clean-up Drive Ends Monday With Collection of Trash

Citizens of San Antonio will have a chance to save from \$3 to \$5 Monday when a gigantic trash haul climaxes the 10-day clean-up drive sponsored by the San Antonio Chamber of Commerce.
 Civic leaders praised the committee's work in organizing the drive. H. L. Bridgman, president of the Fiesta de San Jacinto Association, said, "During Fiesta Week more than half a million people will throng our streets enjoying the various events, and I am sure our visitors will be very favorably impressed by the outstanding work done by the committee."
 Dr. Austin E. Hill, city health director, had previously extolled the clean-up drive as an aid to the health of the citizens of San Antonio.
 O. J. Van Horn, chairman of the chamber of commerce fire prevention committee, approved the campaign as a means of eliminating fire hazards in basements, attics and garages.
 Workers for the trash haul are being recruited by the city sanitation department and will be paid 80 cents an hour. The trucks and the services of the drivers have been donated by business firms.
 Trucks will haul the trash to four dumping areas where it will be covered over by employees of the city sanitation department.
 The amount mentioned is what it would cost the average householder to get rid of his accumulated trash, according to O. P. Schnabel, chairman of the drive. This service will be provided free by 200 clean-up workers on 100 trucks which will pick up dry refuse in all parts of the city.
 Schnabel asked citizens to help the drive by following four simple rules:
 1. Place bottles and cans in cartons.
 2. Tie up newspapers and magazines.
 3. Cut tree limbs and cuttings in four-foot lengths and tie them together.
 4. Place debris at curb or in alley, whichever is the regular pick-up point for the garbage department, by 8:30 a.m. Monday.

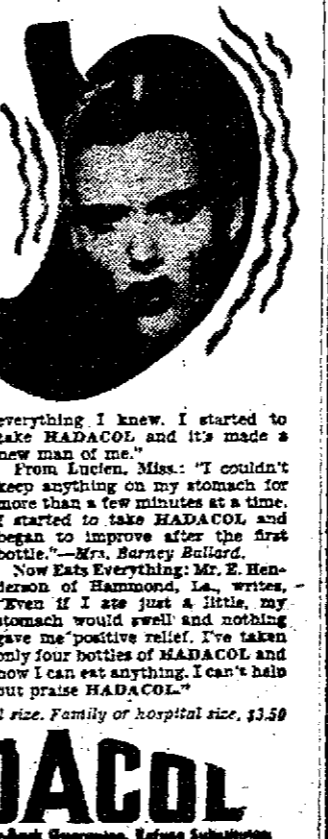
Physician to Study In Disorder Clinic
