### Davis Praises Dulles, Cooper Appointments

WASHINGTON (AP)—Recent appointments of John Foster Dulles and John Sherman Cooper as consultants to Secretary of State Dean Acheson were praised Friday by Rep. Glenn Davis (R-Wis.).

Davis said in a statement the appointments of the two former Republican senators "may do much to restore the era of congressional good feeling toward foreign relations that existed under the leadership of Sen. Arthur Vandenberg in the early days of the Truman administration."

### WERB Orders Union to Curb Picketing

The Wisconsin Employment Relations Board (WERB) ordered a Milwaukee building union that is picketing an apartment house where a janitor is on strike to stop interfering with traffic in and out of the building.

The board, however, refused to rule on the landlord's charges that the union slashed tires, smeared windows and elevators with grease, polluted the water supply, and refused to allow coal deliveries to the building.

The board said there was no proof that Janitor Michael Varga or the union was guilty of the damage charges.

Varga went on strike at the apartment building last December for higher wages. The Building Service Employees union started picketing and kept out coal deliveries.


