Baseball 'Game of the Day' Broadcasts Start April 18

NEW YORK (AP) Picked to start the MBS Game of the Day series of baseball broadcasts the network is inaugurating this season is the opener between the New York Yankees and the Boston Red Sox at Boston on April 18. Thereafter through the season except Sundays, MBS will be on the air with selected games from the two major leagues, giving play by play details to about 350 stations. The idea is to feature games between those teams most likely to be in the pennant race. This will be the first network coverage of regular baseball aside from special games or the world series.

Star's Daughter Honors Mother's Movie Star Fan

HOLLYWOOD. Only rarely is the passionate fan of the stage or screen star rewarded with anything more than an autographed picture, but Teresa Wright went beyond that. Teresa, who recently reached one of the peaks in her highly successful career with a co-starring role with Marlon Brando in Stanley Kramer's "The Men," once had the distinction of being the most ardent fan in all of Maplewood, N. J. The object of her long-distance affection was (and still is) Helen Hayes. From the time she entered her teens, Teresa had kept a scrapbook on Helen Hayes, her stage successes and her late, "act-of-God" daughter, Mary MacArthur. "After seeing Miss Hayes in 'Victoria Regina,' Teresa wrote a glowing fan letter and received a very warm and personal reply, together with a picture. Teresa was so excited she wept. Several years later, with seasons of summer stock and a road company role behind her, Teresa won her battle of Broadway and was given the ingenue lead in Howard Lindsay's 'Life With Father.' It was at a special luncheon given by the 'Life With Father' company for Helen Hayes that Teresa first met her ideal actress. In later years, when Teresa had become a star for Samuel Goldwyn in 'The Little Foxes' and other films, she returned to New York and met Miss Hayes again. By this time, Mary Hayes MacArthur was a leggy teen-ager and something of a fan herself. When Teresa was leaving after the visit, Helen Hayes stopped her and said, 'Oh, you must wait a moment. Mary is coming and I know she wants to meet you. You're her favorite star.'

\$9,000,000 Gift to Irvine Heir Shrinks, Says Dad

MARTINEZ, April 8. (AP) Estimates of the value of nine-year-old William Thornton White III's fabulous inheritance shrank today as the boy's father reported details of the estate left by his son's grandmother, who died last Sunday. "That \$9,000,000 is a lot of baloney," said William Thornton White Jr., 38, referring to the original value placed on the estate left by his mother, Mrs. Katherine Brown Irvine, 62, to his son. The youngster was named sole heir in Mrs. Irvine's 1948 will, filed yesterday for probate. While Mrs. Irvine's second husband, James Irvine, wealthy Oakland lumberman, left an estate of \$9,373,378, when he died in 1947, it did not all go to his wife, it was learned. Irvine will gave Mrs. Irvine one-fourth of the estate, the remainder going to other relatives, friends and organizations. Considering both inheritance and income taxes which have been deducted since then, the boy's windfall may be somewhere in the thousands. It will be inventoried, White Jr., said. The will provides that the boy shall receive up to \$3600 a year for his education and maintenance until he is 21—when he will be paid the entire income from the estates. The boy and his sister, Gay, 11, reside with their mother, Mrs. Gloria White White, in Newport Beach, Calif. The parents are divorced. Mrs. Irvine left vast land holdings in Moraga Valley, near here, in Montana and at Santa Ana, Calif.
