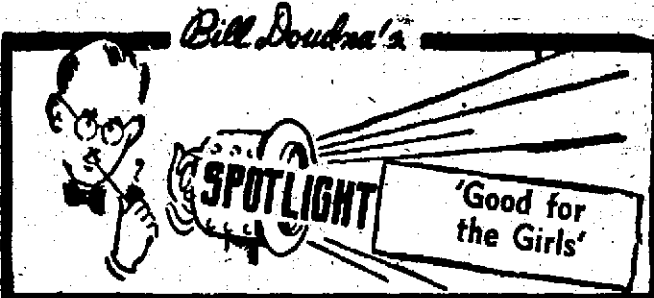


The Orbits

TIP O' THE MORNING: For those who like the blase, Hammitt-like detective yarns—Richard Diamond, Private Detective, starring Dick Powell, switches to Wednesdays this week. It will be on WIBA at 9:30 p. m.

Further comments on "Good for the Girls," 1950 Haresfoot club production, as it was presented Saturday night at Rockford, Ill., first stop on the show's tour.

Some of Don Voegell's tunes cling to the ears—"If I've a Song," "Night Song," "Would You Love Me," and "For Everything There is a Season."

"On Fairfax Hall" is a lively takeoff on typical college songs. Lighting was one of the big problems at Rockford. The high school auditorium had no movable spotlight—and who ever heard of a musical comedy without that piece of equipment?

One of Haresfoot history's funniest routines was a set of calisthenics done by the "red heads"—the pony chorus.

A tradition of the show was abandoned Saturday night. At the finish, the "girls" didn't remove their wigs.

One of the show's important assets was the orchestra, conducted by Voegell. Quality of both arrangement and execution was high.

CORN: Elliott Lewis, forced to make cuts in "Broadway Is My Beat," which he produces and directs for CBS, recalled a New York radio director and a cut that was never made.
