

Harold Mohr Gets 3 to 6-Year Term in Mercy Killing

ALLENTOWN, Pa.—(P)—Harold A. Mohr, convicted of voluntary manslaughter in the so-called mercy killing of his blind, cancerravaged brother, Monday was sen-tenced to 3 to 6 years in prison. Lehigh County Judge James F. Henninger said he "took into consideration" a jury's plea of mercy for the 36-year-old defendant who didn't deny the rifle slaying of Walter Mohr, 55, but testified "I couldn't remember doing it." The maximum sentence was 12

years in prison and a \$6,000 fine. Besides the prison sentence, Mohr was fined \$500. Before sentencing, Judge Hen

ninger said it seems Mohr acted through "the dictates of his con-science" and thus became "a mar-As a martyr, he "must accept willingly the punishment that goes with the breaking of the laws of the state," the jurist said. "If he is a martyr such punishment is both enobling and degrading."







FIFTEEN YEARS OF HITS: Fifteen years and 874 programs ago, come Apr. 22, NBC's "Your Hit Pa-rade" began a weekly measurement of the song-pulse of the nation, de-livering to radio listeners the most popular songs of the times as indicated by special surveys.

Since Apr. 20, 1935, the compilations show, America's favorite songs have been "White Christmas" (played 26 weeks), "I'll Be Seeing You" (24 weeks), "A Tree in the Meadow" and "Some Enchanted Evening" (21 weeks). Each song was No. 1 on "Your Hit Parade" for

10 weeks or more.
