On the Air Waves. FM Broadcasters Hunting New Uses for Their Services. By WAYNE OLIVER. CHICAGO, April 17. (AP) Operators of frequency modulation radio stations delved today into possible cures for the financial woes threatening the survival of that form of broadcasting. In a panel session at the convention of the National Association of Broadcasters, they listened hopefully to reports on results of specialized operations by FM stations. They also heard reports that the number of FM stations on the air has declined since the first of the year, that scores of permits for stations have been turned back, and that there still are only about 5,000, 000 sets in use that are equipped to receive FM. The specialized services include broadcasts designed specifically for radio-equipped buses and trolleys, for stores, and for restaurants, taverns and other public places. The stations make use of dog whistle and supersonic signals-inaudible to the home listener-to raise or lower the volume of the special bus and store sets. This makes it possible to boost the volume automatically when the commercial comes on, to make sure it is heard above the noise of the bus or of conversations in the store. Home sets are not affected. A similar signal is used in reverse by stations supplying a subscription service to restaurants, industrial plants and others wanting music without commercials. The supersonic signal turns down the volume of the special sets in these places to tune out the commercials and talk heard on regular home sets.
