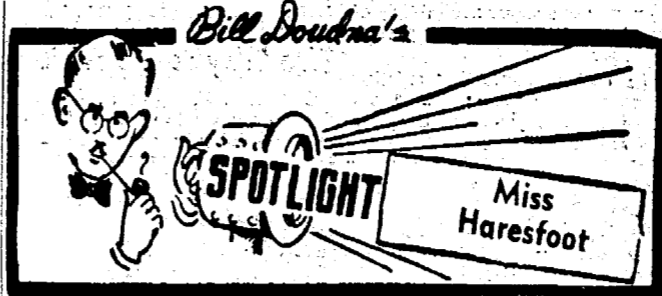

TIP O' THE MORNING: Alfred Drake, the original Curly of "Oklahoma!" will substitute for Bob Crosby on the latter's NBC show at 9:30 p. m. Sunday (WIBA).

For the first time since the Haresfoot club began producing all-male shows, a woman is visible to the audience in the current production, "Good for the Girls."

Backstage, Haresfoot has all ways had women in its personnel, handling wardrobe and other details. And for several years Kathryn Hubbard has directed the dances, with the assistance of Mrs. William Burns.

Before the curtain goes up on "Good for the Girls," Don Voegel conducts his orchestra in the overture — and there, among all those men, sits Merrilyn Hecht with her harp.

Miss Hecht has been a musician since she was 3 years old. When she started playing piano. At 8, she began with the harp; at 10, she played piccolo and flute, and at 12 she took up cello study.

Merrilyn spent five summers at the Interlochen music camp, playing solo harp with the orchestra and piccolo in the band. Last year, she attended Stephens college in Missouri, and helped direct the University of Missouri's musical show.

With all this experience as a musician, her ambition isn't to play—it's to be an arranger. She wants to do the orchestrations for musical shows.

While she studies theory at the University of Wisconsin music school, she also plays in campus musical organizations and is the pianist and harpist on Don Sinaiko's WIBA broadcasts Friday nights. As if this weren't enough, she's a member of the Wisconsin Union dance committee and of Alpha Epsilon Phi sorority.

'SUPERIOR' QUIZ KID: Superior is the word for 9-year-old Darice Richman, pianist and violinist who appears often on NBC's "Quiz Kids" program.

She recently won the rating of "superior" for the fifth straight year in the piano solo division of the annual contest conducted by the Federation of Music Clubs, and for the second year won the same rating for violin solo, concerto, and duo-piano. Darice will be piano soloist with the Chicago Civic orchestra in the 37th annual Youth festival in Orchestra hall.
