TIP OF THE MORNING: Ralph Edwards will have a sort of homecoming Tuesday, May 9, when his "This Is Your Life" show moves to CBS. Edwards made his debut as a full-time network announcer on that web in 1938, and once handled 45 programs a week. Highly informative and usually entertaining, "An Afternoon of Dance" was presented by Orchestras, University of Wisconsin dance organization, for an audience of about 1,250 persons Sunday in the Wisconsin Union theater. While the second half of the program offered first-rate dancing and a good deal of original and mature material, it was the first part which really sold the girls to their audience. This was a lecture-demonstration, given with artistry and showmanship. Good-natured humor and even a little spoofing saluted the meat of the affair. Members of the group explained the basic ideas of contemporary dance—the use of the body as an instrument of expression, the use of rhythm in space, the concept of rhythm's use, and the methods by which ideas can be conveyed to the spectator. Each idea and many of the substantiating ones were demonstrated clearly. Both the script and choreography were prepared by seniors who are majoring in dance. The second period employed a bit of verbal explanation, too, which helped considerably in understanding the dance—although most of them were done with sufficient clarity to make the words somewhat superfluous. This was particularly true of "Impetus," a striking picture of how personalities change through generations. Done largely in duet form, the dance flowed continuously through its episodes with half of each duo moving into the next segment. Ruth Belew and Mary Hinkson did an adroit abstract, called simply "Duo," and Miss Hinkson, Miss Belew, and Marjorie Muehl Parkin repeated their "Word
