**135 Drivers Nabbed for Overweight Trucks**

MILWAUKEE (UP)—State traffic patrolmen said Wednesday they issued summonses to about 135 truck drivers in the Milwaukee area the first day of a drive on overweight trucks.

Capt. A. M. Haanstad, Eau Claire, and Capt. W. J. Philip, Milwaukee, directing the checkup, said most of the violations were for overloading trucks and lack of registration.

Haanstad said the Milwaukee area checkup is one of several being conducted in the state.

Warrants will be sought through the district attorney's office here, naming truck owners, not the drivers, for offenses, he said.
