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# Husband of Slain Waitress Hunted

SACRAMENTO, April 29. (AP) The husband of a 24-year-old bride of one month, found dead from blows on the head, was sought by police today on charges of murder.

Authorities said a murder warrant had been issued for Jack R. Atkins, 30, charging him with beating his wife to death after a violent argument over \$10 she had withheld from her wages as a waitress in a coffee shop.

The murder victim, Audrey Atkins, a slender, brown-eyed brunette from Boise, Idaho, died of cerebral hemorrhage, the coroner's office said. She was discovered sprawled across her bed in a rooming house by her worried employer after she failed to show up for work on time.

Mrs. Neva Atkins, owner of the rooming house, said she overheard the couple quarreling over money withheld from Mrs. Atkins' pay check.

Authorities said Atkins has a former wife and two children in Boise and recently was discharged from the Army at Camp Hood, Texas, where he had served a six-months term, w. o. l. term.

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# Hirohito Hailed on 49th Birthday

TOKYO, April 29. (AP) More than 100,000 visitors from all corners of Japan paid tribute to Emperor Hirohito today on his 49th birthday.

They swarmed through the grounds of Tokyo's imperial palace and signed their names in a guest book while Hirohito held a private anniversary celebration with members of his immediate family.

Once during the day the emperor appeared on the balcony of a palace building and waved his hat to the holiday throng. The crowd went wild with shouts of "banzai" and sang the national anthem, "Kimigayo"—"The Emperor Reigns."

Actually, however, the real ruler of Japan—Gen. Douglas MacArthur—sat a few hundred yards away across a moat in a sixth floor office of a modern business building.

The emperor's birthday celebration today was simple and without pomp compared to the days when he was a god to his subjects and Japan held sway over half of Asia.
