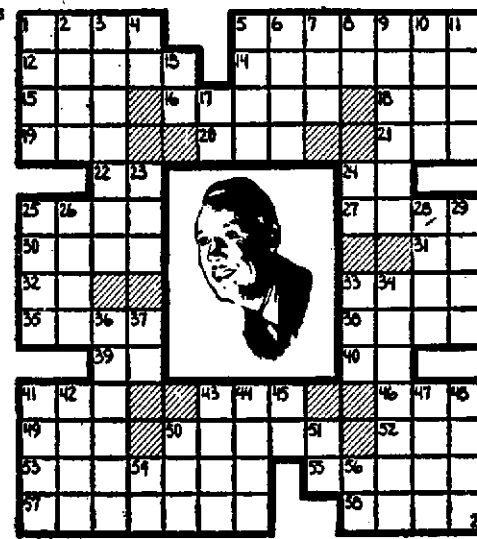

"My wife and I wouldn't dream of arguing about a bridge hand," writes J. B. T. of Chicago, "so we're being very polite to each other these days. Please tell us who's right and who's wrong in this hand. Then maybe we can go back to bickering good-naturedly."
"Friend wife said I shouldn't bid so much. I said she ought to pass three hearts, which I would have made. Who is right?"

I'm happy to say that both were wrong. The husband was right to bid a lot, but he shouldn't have bid three hearts. When he did bid three hearts, his wife was right to bid four hearts.
The best rebid with the South hand is not three hearts but two no trump. Such a bid says: "I have a strong hand which will probably be strong enough for game if you have about one and a half honor tricks. (I may get by with even less, if you have scattered picture cards in three or four suits.) I have strength

French 'Voices' Still on Strike

PARIS. (E.P.) Clark Gable's perfect Parisian accent may trail off on French movie scenes soon if his "voice" stays on strike much longer.
The French actors and actresses who dub French dialogue into Hollywood movies have been out for weeks, demanding more pay and work guarantees.
Major U. S. movie distributors said the backlog of movies in which Gable, Rita Hayworth and other Paris favorites "speak" in impeccable French has just about been exhausted.
The "dubbers"—there are 100 of them in Paris—make about \$100 a picture to speak a star role in French. They say they're more, since it is "delicate and fatiguing" work to put French words into the mouths of Hollywood's great and synchronize with the slurring lip-movements of some of the American stars.
The strike is led by the National Actors' Union, affiliated with the pro-Communist General Confederation of Labor (C. G. T.).

HONG KONG. (E.P.) Most of China's movie stars have agreed to cut out the glamour. Eighty-two leading Chinese actors and actresses are reported by the leftist newspaper Ta Kung Pao to have expressed willingness to adhere to a "laboring life pact."
All 82 have taken refuge in Hong Kong, which today is China's Hollywood. Before the Communists overran the mainland, Shanghai was the film capital of China. Since the Red occupation of the city, however, the distinction has come to this British crown colony.
Hong Kong's film industry is not subject to Red laws but has found it necessary to fall into line with the Communists. Red China is the principal market. All films must pass Red censors.
