Austrian Vote Hands Russia Major Setback

VIENNA. Austria—(AP)— Municipal voters in lower Austria handed Communist candidates their greatest setback in an election in Russian-occupied territory since the end of the war, the re-turns showed Monday.

The voters kicked out 10 of the 11 Soviet-appointed mayors and registered a total anti-Communist vote of 95 per cent.

The only Communist mayor to he elected received a plurality in the village of Pottenstein. But he. too, may lose his office if the anti-Communist parties combine their forces and select a coalition

mayor.

The elections held Sunday ended in an overwhelming victory for the right wing People's Party which won 13,462 mayoralty and council seats in 1,583 communities. The anti-Communist Socialists won 6.233 seats, while the left bloc-Communists and Radical Socialists -garnered only 397,




