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Second Flotsam Prize Ball Found

Antonio Brasil, impoverished Azores farmer who found the first of the 10 plastic balls dropped in the Atlantic by Art Linkletter on NBC's "People Are Funny" show, has written that soon after his return to his island home his wife presented him with their 11th child—a boy. The couple now stands at six boys and five girls. Linkletter has received word via cable that the second of the plastic balls has been found. The cable was sent from Fair Isle, Lerwick, Scotland, dated April 14, and contained just four words—the man's name and address and the secret word. Farmer Brasil in the Azores, who was earning about \$100 a year until he was awarded \$2000 in cash and prizes by Linkletter on the "People Are Funny" show and now owns his own farm land, had sent a 20-word cable announcing his find.
