Bexar Red Cross To Hear Editor At Annual Meet

Walter R. Humphrey, editor of the Fort Worth Press, will address the annual meeting of Bexar County Chapter, American Red Cross, at noon Tuesday at a luncheon on the Plaza Hotel roof.

Humphrey, one of Texas' best known newspapermen, will speak on Red Cross service in Fort Worth during and after the devastating flood which crippled that community just one year ago. During the flood he served as a member of the advisory committee which passed on all Red Cross awards to flood victims. This committee met twice weekly for a two-month period and approved \$1,750,000.

Humphrey's first-hand account of how Red Cross meets disasters on the scope which hit Fort Worth has proved of wide interest and he is frequently in demand as a speaker in many parts of the state. He is a past president of the Texas Press Association, a former district governor of the Lions Club and is a director of the Brazos River Conservation and Reclamation District.
