Kevin O'Morrison will lift "The Golden Gloves Story" far above the average prize fight picture, and this new Hollywood personality top boy will crowd the best of them for real he-man's glamour!

On your bookshelf you will find "The Sunnier Side" by Charles Jackson (The Lost Weekend) a very fine glimpse into your boyhood; "The Company of Men" by Romain Gary, translated from the French with some of the most shocking scenes of our world today; "Roof of the World" by Amaury de Riencourt, an expose of Tibet, the private mystical world of the Dalai Lama, his quaint philosophy and his daily life; "If You Were Born in Russia," by Arthur Goodfriend, who gives us the astonishing daily life of an ordinary citizen in the Soviet today, where one must lose their individuality completely. On your music rack you will find three oldies of the late 20's "Sunny Side of the Street," "Sunny Side Up" and "Sonny Boy!"
