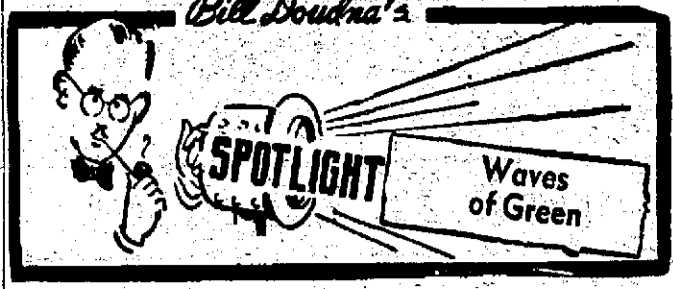

Work of the country's 52 land grant colleges—of which the University of Wisconsin is one—has been told interestingly and forcefully in "Waves of Green," a Technicolor picture shown Monday at the Play Circle of the Memorial Union.

The screening here was coincident with the world premiere at Nashville, N. C., which Secretary of Agriculture Charles F. Brannan and members of congress attended. At the conclusion of the Madison screening, General Manager R. J. Somers of the Wisconsin Tractor and Equipment Co., Fond du Lac, presented a print of the film to Dean R. K. Froker of the university college of agriculture.

In the audience were men who bridged the time between establishment of the college of agriculture and the present. Dean Froker noted. Among them were H. L. Russell, former dean, who was an associate of the late Dean W. A. Henry, first head of the college and men who had worked with Russell.

"Waves of Green" is the story of cooperation among government, education, industry and farmers that dates back to 1862, when Abraham Lincoln signed the Morrill act, which provided for aids for state agricultural schools and which, with great foresight, also permitted use of the funds for the "mechanic arts"—the engineering which has helped agriculture's growth.

It tells of crop-saving in the wheatlands; of changes in major crops in the fruit valleys; of ambitious shavers in the Carolinas; of balanced farming, poultry experimentation, field rotation, gardening, home improvement—all aided by the scientists of the land-grant colleges.

It's a fascinating film, with touches of humor in its narration and beautiful filming of campus, farm, and orchard scenes.
