



## To Further Arming of Democratic Allies

WASHINGTON -(U.P)- Secreary of State Dean Acheson will ask congress this week for a second instalment of \$1,250,000,000 Smuts, South African to continue arming this nation's Statesman, Falls III democratic allies against possible Russian; attack.

Senate leaders, including some who opposed the original military assistant program, said there was an "excellent" chance the request will be approved in view of the "solid" economic and military achievements of the West in the past year.

The proposed program will in-clude about \$1,000,000,000 in new cash and contract authority for the North Atlantic pact nations and perhaps \$150,000,000 to shore up the defenses of Grezce, Turkey, Korea, Iran, and the Philip

In addition, Acheson may request \$100,000,000 to be spent in the "general area" of China Most of this money presumably would be earmarked for Indo-China, the Malay Peninsula, and Southeast Asia, where a Red thrust is in full swing. The request is intended to back

up the original \$1,000,000,000 arms PROF. PHILO M. BUCK program under which bombers

ships, tanks, and guns are flowing to Western Europe and other cold war fronts.

Republican Sens. Robert A. Taft O., and Kenneth S. Wherry, Neb., have indicated they will oppose the program again this year. The senate approved the original plan

55 to 24 after it was overhauled to meet GOP objections. But Chairman Tom Connally (D. Tex.) of the foreign relations committee, and Sen. Walter F. George (D-Ga.) predicted prompt congressional approval. Both voted against the program last year.
