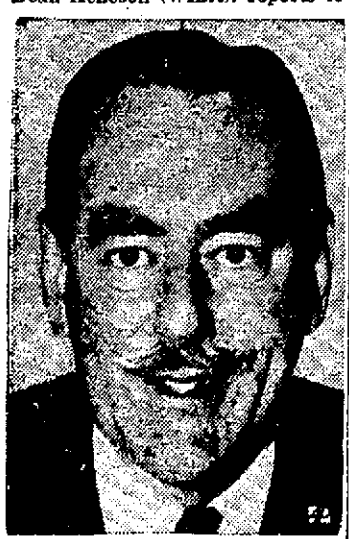

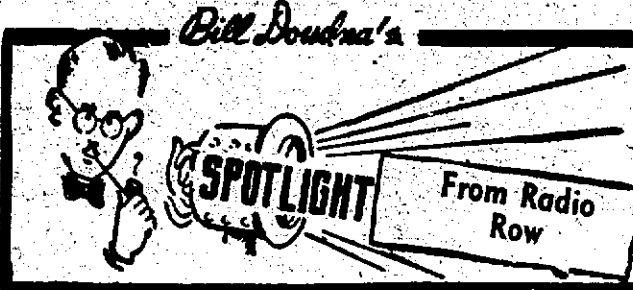

as well as command, than U. S. parents. He added that the rate of juvenile delinquency in Germany is lower than in the U. S.

As a result of the collapse of the German war effort at a time when the younger generation believed it could make German and the world over, distrust of any and all programs, democratic or otherwise, is today one of the outstanding mental traits of Germans under thirty, the sociologist explained.

"Where all else has crumbled, large sections of German family structures have survived. The old direct challenge to parental control proclaimed by the youth movement is no longer offered; if it were, it would fall on deaf ears," Dr. Becker concluded.
