Bill Doudna's SPOTLIGHT Puppet Shows

TIP O' THE MORNING: An exhibition of contemporary art which promises to be one of the finest ever assembled in the Midwest is being planned for the University of Wisconsin summer session.

One of the oldest forms of drama, the puppet show, is in the smash-hit business these days, says the National Geographic society. And the report from the society continues: The modern magic of television has given the clever mannikin a stage and an audience such as they never commanded before. But this unprecedented wave of popularity is not entirely a matter of electronics. Puppets are also doing right well in "live" performances, presented to U. S. enthusiasts by more than a hundred professional companies now annually touring the country. It's the same story overseas, even without benefit of widespread TV. In theaters from Belgium to Brazil, the miniature actors of comic or heroic roles are reported attracting ever larger numbers of spectators to view the new and traditional themes of this special art.

eras, comedies, tragedies, as well as plays written especially for the small actors themselves. In Salzburg, noted for its music festivals, one set of puppet performers is accompanied by the music of a full orchestra and the singing of real opera stars. In America, while wandering companies are recorded before the middle 1700s, puppet shows had a limited appeal at first. The art had a revival in the United States during the early 20th century, but it remained for the current boom to make puppet history. This country now has one of the world's few exclusively puppet-making factories, turning out annually nearly 50,000 toy actors for use in educational projects, for children's play, and professional drama.
