Treasury Bond Drive Show on KNBH Friday

KNBH will carry the full hour Treasury Department bond drive over Channel 4, Friday, 9:30 to 10:30 p. m. Such national figures as President Harry S. Truman, Secretary of the Treasury John W. Snyder, Chief of Naval Operations Forrest Sherman; FCC Commissioner Frieda Henock; Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas; President of the University of Pennsylvania Harold E. Stassen; Chief of ECA Paul Hoffman, and many others will be seen. The show, which will launch the Independence Loan Campaign, will have a "Talent Scout" format, with television's popular Arthur Godfrey as master of ceremonies. The government personalities will present their "discoveries" well known stars of stage, radio and television, Sid Caesar and Imogene Coca, of NBC-TV's "Saturday Night Revue"; "Supper Club" singing star Perry Como with the Fontane sisters; Morten Downey, vocalists Vic Damone and Bill Lawrence; Opera Star Gladys Swartout and Comedian Jerry Colonna. President Truman will be seen from Chicago and will close the program with an appeal for national support of the drive. The program originated in New York, with a switch to Chicago to pick up the President's address, and to Washington for Douglas and Sherman.

Value of Formosa Stressed by Radford

TOKYO, June 6. (AP) Adm. Arthur W. Radford, commander of the U. S. Pacific fleet, warned today that the island of Formosa would be a serious threat to American bases in the Pacific if it fell into Russian hands. The island, last stronghold of the Chinese nationalists, is expected to be attacked soon by the Chinese Communists.

Oklahoma Picnic

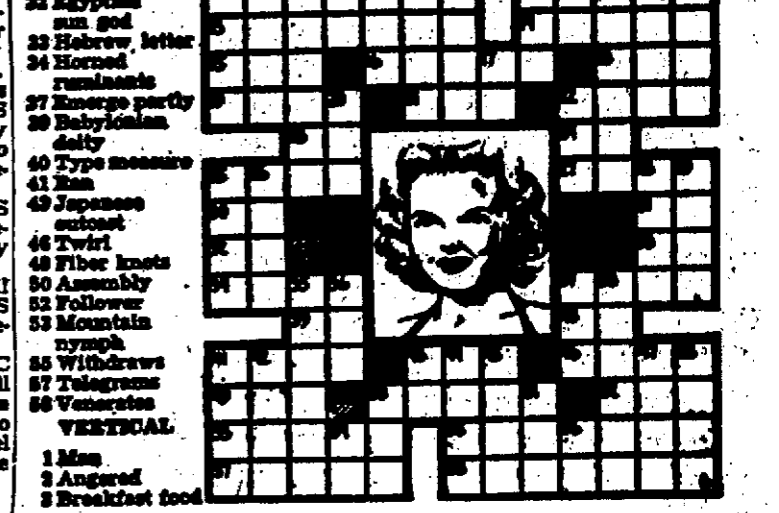

Soviet-Finnish Trade Pact Due

HELSINKI, Finland, June 6. (AP) A new Soviet-Finnish trade pact will be signed in Moscow possibly tomorrow, Finnish Trade Minister Sakari Tuomioja said today in a telephone conversation from the Soviet capital. He said that 21, have led to an agreement for an exchange of goods during the rest of this year and provides a framework for mutual trade between the two countries for the next five years. The minister said only volume of trade had been agreed upon thus far and the question of prices will be discussed later. The pact envisages a gradually expanding trade, with Finland exporting mainly products of its metal and forest industries such as prefabricated houses and wooden ships in return Finland will receive Soviet grain and fuel oil.
