WASHINGTON - (A) - The Taft-Hartley act's chief enforce-ment officer said Monday that employers can't be forced to deal

jointly with a union.

Robert N. Denham, general counsel of the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB), said an employer can insist on bargaining only for his own workers.

ham, doesn't have to heed a union demand that he join other employers in bargaining for all their
