## Six Street Bids Above Estimates

Lowest bids on six out of nine street and sewer construction jobs, opened Wednesday by the city board of public works, exceeded preliminary estimates, according to tabulations in the office of City Engineer Tim Harrington.

Three were below estimates. The bids will be reported to the city council Friday night for acceptance or rejection.

**Above Estimates**  
New bids on three East side streets, readvertised after rejection of original offers last month, were down \$2,733, but were still \$5,411 above estimates, Harrington said.

Icke and Pankow were low, at \$54,911, on paving of Clover Lane from Sargent st. to Royster ave. Sargent st. from Margaret to Royster, and Olbrich av. Busse to Royster.

The previous low bid was \$57,644 and the estimate was \$49,500. Other bidders on this contract were H. M. Engelhart, \$56,847; Harrington and Cordio, \$55,200; and Mike Oliver, \$57,029.

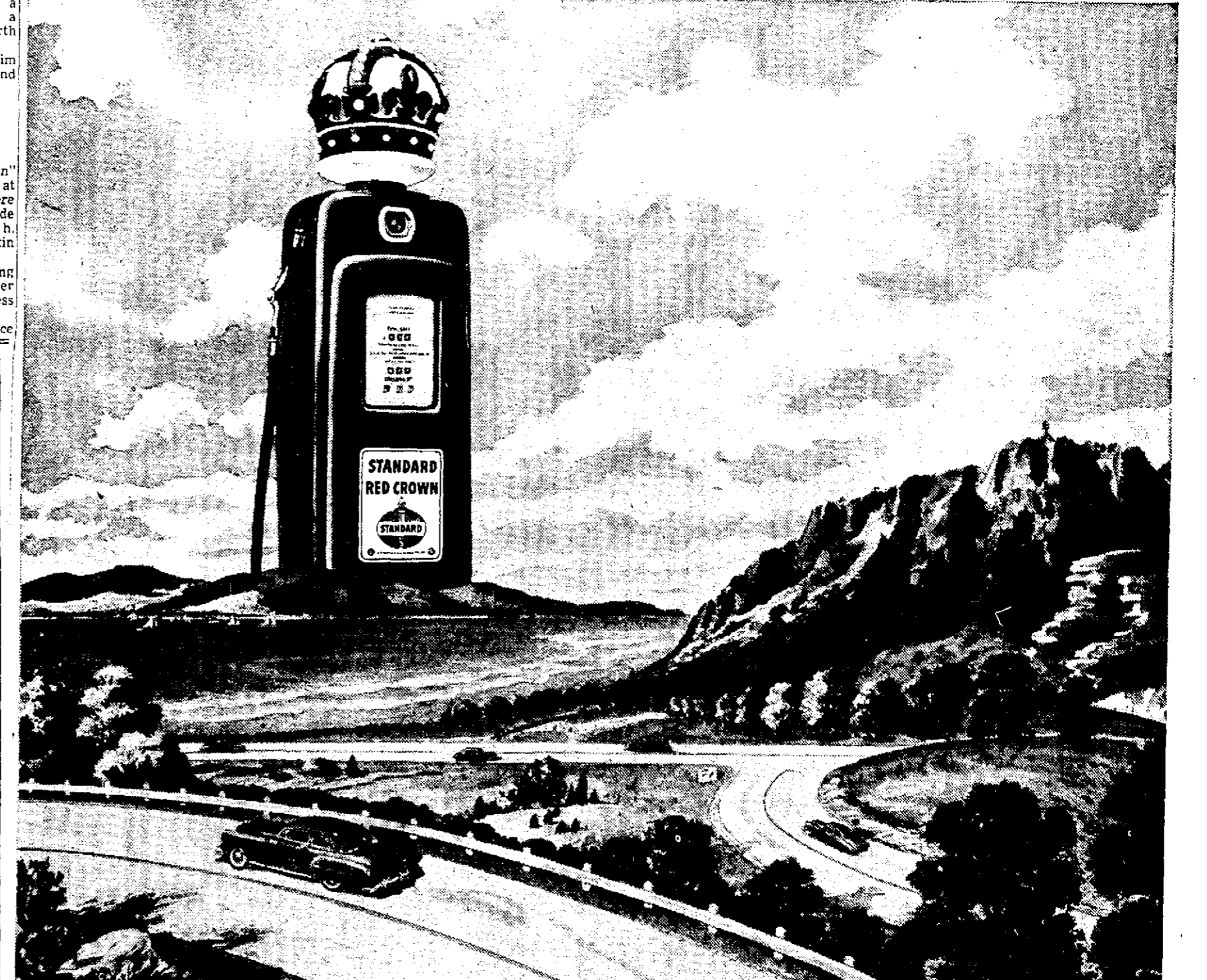
