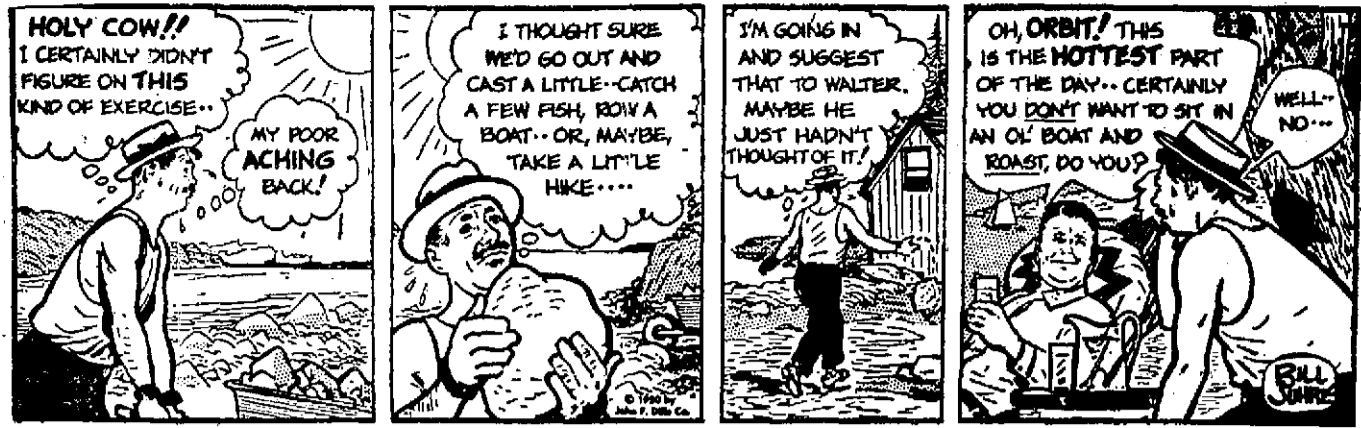

In response to an invitation by the American Theater and Academy (ANTA), the Wisconsin Idea theater conference has submitted some of its ideas for creation of a national theater. The conference is a newly-formed group of the state's community theaters which has grown out of a creative arts program at the University of Wisconsin.

The conference proposal will be considered, with others, when the American National Theater assembly meets in Washington, D. C. in January, 1951, to work out a national theater program.

Main points of the proposal which, according to Martha Van Kleef, executive secretary of the conference and university staff member, was forwarded to ANTA this week, are:

ONE. That a foundation type of subsidy for a national theater be established, and that funds for the foundation be furnished, at least in part, by the federal government;

TWO: That the national theater foundation funds be administered by a central office (presumably ANTA) with the control of a central administrative committee representing both professional and non-professional theater interests;

THREE. That due consideration be given to the development of a total popular arts consciousness in America to which theater may make a major contribution;

FOUR. That a clear understanding be reached between non-professional theater interests and theater trade unions so that non-professional theater may continue to train, educate, and develop theater workers without fear of possible hampering trade union restrictions;

FIVE. That regional recommendations be reached between non-professional theater interests and theater trade unions so that non-professional theater may continue to train, educate, and develop theater workers without fear of possible hampering trade union restrictions;
