## Doubling Opponents Shaky Contracts Piles Up Big Score

The biggest profits in bridge passed to find out what his partner could do. He should have realized that his partner might be waiting to pounce on just such a flimsy bid.

If North could not double three hearts, he would surely be able to raise the spades or bid one of the minors. In that case, there would be time enough for South to show the length and strength of his spades, and a final game contract in spades would probably be reached. In other words, South could lose nothing by passing. There was no risk of missing the game, whatever happened.

As it happened, however, North would have doubled three hearts with great gusto. Normal defense would enable North and South to collect at least 1100 points. This would be worth more than twice as much as the value of the game that South made at spades.
