Bill Doudna's SPOTLIGHT Guest Column

In almost every big city, and in many smaller ones, there are smoldering areas of juvenile delinquency, yet it's only when one bursts into frightening flame that the nation focuses attention on the basic problem of juvenile discontent.

Yet even when public indignation demands action, it's usually directed against individual hoodlums rather than against the factors which produce terrorizing young gangs.

I believe that only an infinitesimal fraction of these youngsters is incurably bad. Give youngsters something to fill their hands and minds, and they stand an excellent chance of shaking clear of destructive environment.

At this point, you're probably wondering where a Hollywood musician gets off spouting so volubly, and what connection there is between music and these anti-social kids.

My answer is that America's future lies in the hands of these boys and girls, our rank-and-file citizens, and possibly our leaders, within five to 10 years. I regard music, and especially the orchestra, as a powerful influence for good, and a first-class deterrent against going "bad."

I consider the orchestra the most practical and soundest economic medium in "dollar and cents," for youth participation on a large scale.

Each orchestral unit can directly reach 50 to 100 youngsters—more than participate in both football and basketball in the average high school. And orchestra players see action all the time—there are no bench-warming substitutes. Teamwork, unselfishness and obedience—all character-building qualities—are the base of an orchestral organization. The job for parents is to encourage music appreciation and to make music lessons possible—and palatable—for their kids. That the children will react favorably has been proved all over the country. In Los Angeles, they throng to the regular Saturday morning concerts and—comment series presented by the Los Angeles Philharmonic.

As a musician, a father, and a member of an active community, I don't see any reason why we can't have All-American competition and awards in orchestras just as we have in athletics. Youngsters by the millions will be drawn into this wholesome program either as participants or as radio listeners and television viewers. Radio—the artists, the networks and the sponsors—would stand ready to back up a coast-to-coast movement.

I love the idea. I think it can work. I'd like to see it tried in my town... and in your town.
