
Doctor Who Criticized His Profession Dies

CHICAGO — (P) — A doctor whose criticism of his profession cost him his Chicago medical society membership, died Tuesday. He was Dr. Joseph A. Jerger, 70, author of the best-selling book, 'Doctor, Here's Your Hat."

Largely autobiographical, the book assailed specialization in medicine and high fees. It appeared in 1939 and was condensed in national magazines and reprint-

ed in five foreign languages.

The same year it was published the author was brought before the medical society on charges of un-ethical conduct and expelled. After a fight against the action, Dr. Jerger won reinstatement in 1940.
