Alcoholic Center Has 245 Patients **During First Year**

Madison's center for treatment of alcoholics in the E. Washington hospital had 245 patients in its first year of operation since opening last July, the city health de-partment reported Thursday,

Dr. C. K. Kincaid, health commissioner, said "an amazing number" of the patients already have paid their fees, which include a flat \$10 admission fee, \$5 daily for Madison residents, and \$7 daily for non-residents.

Out of charges billed, totaling \$11,231, \$4,678 has been paid, Dr. Kincaid said.

Last month 21 patents were admitted and three were still at the

center on July 1. The charges, totaling \$11,231, do not cover the cost of operation for which the state contributes \$25,000 yearly. Kincaid explained.
