On the Air Waves

Paul Whiteman to Present Annual Gershwin Program

NEW YORK, July 9. (AP) Paul Whiteman is to present his annual tribute to the late George Gershwin in his summer broadcast series next Tuesday night on ABC. The occasion is the thirteenth anniversary of the composer's death.

For this time only the program will be expanded to an hour. The entire period will be devoted to the playing of Gershwin numbers, including "Rhapsody in Blue," which Whiteman has used as his theme song since it was written.

Another musical item comes in announcement that Leopold Stokowski, noted symphony conductor, is to serve as commentator in a classical "disc jockey" type series to run four weeks only on WNBC, New York City station of NBC. The music will be Stokowski's recordings of Johann Sebastian Bach's works in remembrance of the 200th anniversary of the composer's death.

When smiling Ed McConnell comes back on the air for another season next month he will add television for the first time. His radio resumes Aug. 12 at the old morning time.

Cannery Unions Call Off Strikes

SAN DIEGO, July 8. (AP) 1,400 fish cannery unions representing nearly 30,000 workers today delayed threatening work stoppages to continue negotiations for higher wages.

At Van Camp Sea Food Co. tuna unloading, halted Thursday, was resumed after Food, Tobacco and Agricultural Workers Union (Ind.) employees voted to extend their labor contract, due to expire today, to July 17, averting a possible strike.

The union is seeking a 30-cent-an-hour "package" increase in wages and other benefits.

Fred Martinez, acting secretary of the A. F. L. Cannery Workers Union, said no work stoppage at Westgate-Sun Harbor, High Seas, San Diego and People's canneries would come before Sept. 1.

The union is negotiating for a 25-cent-an-hour wage increase for 2,000 employees at the four canneries.
