51 Renters, Claiming Eviction, Seek MHA Help for Housing

The Madison Housing Authority (MHA) received 165 applications for housing during June, 51 of them citing "eviction" as the reason for the request, according to a report of MHA activity released today. That their present housing was temporary constituted reasons for 43 of the new applications, and 31 said they needed different housing to enable them to bring their families to Madison. None of the applicants cited overcrowded or substandard conditions as reasons for wishing new quarters. On hand July 1 were 76 rooms, 15 light housekeeping rooms, 12 furnished apartments, three unfurnished apartments, and three cottages or houses. During June the MHA received an average of 88 calls and interviews a day in regard to applications for housing. Other reasons for new applications were marriages, 16; doubled up families, 20; families living apart, four, and landlords not permitting children, undetermined, the report revealed. 'Lily of Quito' Is Holy Year's 7th New Saint

VATICAN CITY —(AP)— Maria Anna de Paredes, who offered her life to save her plague-stricken people in 17th century Ecuador, was elevated to sainthood Sunday. Her canonization — the seventh and last of the 1950 holy year — was witnessed by 40,000 persons, including 450 Ecuadorian pilgrims. Pope Pius XII presided at the solemn ceremony in St. Peter's basilica. The solemnity of the canonization was interrupted midway in the ceremony by a fire on a cornice of the church.
