#### \$80,000 Price Tag Put on Each Traffic Death

CLEVELAND, O.-(UP)-The National Street and Traffic Safety Lighting Bureau estimates that it costs nearly \$80,000 for each traffic death. That includes such items as doctor bills, insurance costs, property damage, lost wages, and other items incurred by survivors and witnesses.

Against that, the Bureau said it would cost \$2 to \$2.50 per capita per year for adequate lighting that would save 10,000 lives.




