'Sing It Again' Giveaway to Be on Both Radio, TV

NEW YORK. (AP) When Sing It Again, CBS giveaway, adds television it will do it differently than the competitive Stop the Music of ABC. That program has separate versions, radio Sunday nights and TV Thursday nights.

Sing It will go on both media simultaneously, retaining its present Saturday night schedule. The switchover is scheduled for early in the fall upon the return of the Ken Murray TV Show, which is to remain 8 to 9. The new Frank Sinatra program is being projected for the next hour, with Sing It to follow.

Feminine Singers Climbing in Favor as Video Stars

NEW YORK. (AP) Feminine personality singers seem to be the latest emphasis on radio prospect. Fall return of Ginny Simms is one indication. Another is the renewed stress NBC has been giving to Mindy Carson.

Ginny's new series will be on ABC, as already announced, where she will have 15 minutes on Sunday nights beginning Sept. 17 under the title of Song Shop. She will be assisted by the Buddy Cole Trio on the sponsored program.

One of Ginny's most recent programs was a series of her own on CBS which she concluded a couple seasons ago.

Mindy Carson now is occupying three of the late night song spots on NBC originally developed when the Morton Downey tenor series was transferred from MBS. He is now off the air, to return in October on CBS.

Until mid-August Mindy is singing on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. On Aug. 17 she will shift to Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays to present a 12-week series on behalf of ROTC recruiting for the fall college terms.

To take over after Meet The Press concludes a run of nearly five years on MBS, the network reports it is setting up a new series entitled "Reporters' Roundup." It will be Thursday nights beginning Aug. 10.

With Esprit Holes as moderator, MBS said it plans to ask various personalities in the news to appear as guests, as in Meet The Press, but with the added feature of including questions from listeners.

Meet The Press, now Friday nights on MBS, will close Aug. 4. A separate television version is being continued with the possibility that the radio version ultimately may transfer to NBC.

Martha Roundtree is moderator of the TV series and Lawrence E. Spivack of the radio. They are co-owners of the program.
