Burl Ives: "Got the World by the Tail" and "My Momma Told Me." Two tunes that combine the rhythm and folk approaches, coupled with the Ives charm.

Billie Rolliday: "God Bless the Child" and "Am I Blue." Reissues of particular interest to collec-

Toni Arden: "Tonight," new ballad sung warmly, and "Why?," an oldie; don't confuse it with the current song based on Drigo's "Serenade. Percy Faith's orchestra helps the former, but the Billboard aptly describes the latter's orchestral backing as 'baf-

Dick Jurgens: "I'm Headin' West" and "My Scandinavian Baby," with vocals by Al Galante. Typical Jurgens novelties, pleasant at the moment but not likely to last.

Sarah Vaughan: "You Taught Me to Love

Again" and "Just Friends." Frankly straightsinging, and nice going.

Benny Goodman: "Bewitched," and "Blues in the Night." Two notable reissues, with Helen Forrest singing.

Tony Bennett: "The Boulevard of Broken Dreams," and "I Wanna Be Loved." I'm not really recommending this, because it's ton much like Frankie Laine's average, but Marty Manning's orchestra gives it some interest.


Kay Kyser: "It's the Little Things," with vocal by Harry Babbitt, and "Let's Choo Choo Choo," vocal by Sue Bennett and Campus Kids. Recommended because of Harry Babbitt's swell singing. The second side isn't much.

Rosemary Clooney: "Little Johnny Chicadee" and "Peterkin Pillowby." The youngsters will probably love these, although the first is by far the better. Percy Faith's orchestra accompanies Rosemary creditably.

Dinah Shore: "I'll Always Love You" and "I Didn't Know What Time It Was." Dinah does part of the former in Spanish, and the whole think's a delectable piece of singing. Latter doesn't fare so well.

Harry James: "Flathush Flanagan" and "I'll Get By," vocal by Dick Haymes. Another pair of reissues, and definitely worth reviving.
