

East wins the heart trick and returns another spade, forcing out declar-er's last top trump and taking out dummy's last trump.

The point that Joe overlooked is that you cannot punish a low contract if you allow declarer to make his low trumps by ruffing. You must lead trumps at every opportunity in order to draw declarer's trumps.
