Broadcasters Make Deal, to Resume Fight Programs

NEW YORK. (AP) Although no announcements have been made, settlement of the differences over the sharing of the amounts paid by the networks to boxing for the radio-TV rights is expected to see a return of the sport to the air by fall.

Last winter ABC did the radio and NBC the telecasts of Madison Square Garden events, with CBS-TV handling outside bouts in New York and other cities. This arrangement is expected to continue.

In its new contract with the promoters—the International Boxing Club—the New York Boxing Managers Guild won its point, a 50 per cent or better boost in the share of the rights money.
