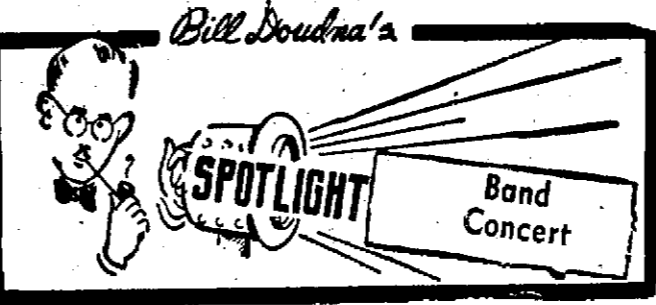

Ernest Stanke, director of instrumental music at Madison West high school, will conduct the organization, made up of members of Local 166 of the AFL American Federation of Musicians.

The concert will be made possible by a grant from the music performance trust fund of the radio industry.

IN WYOMING: The Pro Arte quartet of the University of Wisconsin this summer is introducing western audiences to the best in chamber music by traditional and modern composers, enthusiastic reports from Laramie, Wyo., indicate.

The quartet travelled west in June for the second annual Creative Arts workshop in the University of Wyoming summer session, June 19-July 21.

The members of the quartet—Rudolf Kolisch, first violin; Albert Kahler, second violin; Bernard Milofsky, viola; and Ernst Friedlander, cello—have played five public concerts in Laramie, in addition to their daily work with master string classes.

The group started the series June 22 with a program including Mozart's "Quartet in C Major," Berg's "Lyric Suite," and Debussy's "Quartet in G Minor."

The second concert on June 29 began with Schoenberg's "Quartet in D Minor," and included Schubert's "Quartet in G Major," Haydn's "Quartet in G Major," Bartok's "Sixth Quartet," and Beethoven's "Quartet in E Minor."

July 11 found the group playing Beethoven's "Quartet in F Minor," Webern's "Five Movements for String Quartet," and Regler's "Quartet in A Major," with Robert Wagner as guest clarinetist.

In the final concert of the series on July 18 they gave their audience Beethoven's "Quartet in B Flat Major" and Dvorak's "Quintet in A Major."

Other events in the Creative Arts workshop include the world premiere of William Saroyan's "A Western Awakening," especially written for the workshop theater, and lectures by Paul Engle and Walter Van Tilburg Clark.

The quartet will return to the campus in early September to resume courses and concerts at the University of Wisconsin.

ORGAN RECITAL: An organ recital will be played by Ruth Pilger Andrews of Madison on the Consonata organ at the First Lutheran church of Lodi at 8 p. m. Sunday.

Compositions by Johann Sebastian Bach, who died 200 years ago July 28, will include "Tocatta and Fugue in D Minor," and the choral preludes "Now Thank We All Our God," "If Thou But Suffer God to Now Wounded," "O Sacred Head, Awake, for Night Is Flying."

The remaining compositions will be "Tocatta No. 1," Johann Schuabel; "Traumeri," Robert Schumann; "Festival Prelude on 'A Mighty Fortress,'" Carl Schiller; "Sonata No. 5," Felix Mendelssohn; "Echo," Pietro Yon; and "Finale from Symphony No. 1," Louis Vierne.

GOSPEL QUARTET: The Gospel Singers of Bryan university, in east Tennessee, will give a concert at 8 p. m. Monday in the Gospel Mission church, Arena. Members are Roy Clark, Bob Bryant, Dean Kooz, and Charles Taber. Their accompanist is Ross King.

Leading the group will be Dean D. W. Ryther of the university, who will show color movies of the school and its neighborhood.

ON THE AIR: The Vienna Philharmonic orchestra will open a new series of symphonic programs called "Orchestras of the World" at 8 tonight over WHA-FM and the state FM network.

Prof. Rudolf Moritt will direct the orchestra in a program of modern and classical Austrian compositions Mozart, Franz Schmidt, and Schubert.

The series of 15 programs, to be heard each week at the same time, are being brought together from such widely separated capitals as Lisbon, Stockholm, Athens, and Dublin.

Orchestras taking part include the Turin Symphony, Italy; the Swedish Radio Symphony orchestra; the Orchestre Nationale de France; the Radio Eiricann orchestra of the Irish republic; the B.B.C. Symphony orchestra, England; the Oslo Philharmonic, Norway; the Belgian National orchestra; the Danish State Radio Symphony; the Portuguese Symphony.

State Teachers College Enrolment Now 7,100

Summer school enrolment in Wisconsin's nine state teachers colleges has reached 7,100, an increase of 1,500 over the average figure.

Eugene R. McPhee, director, said Friday there were three major reasons for the summer increase.

They included stiffening of requirements for permit teachers by the state department of public instruction, improved opportunities for jobs in elementary teaching, and lack of summer work for teachers.

Enrolment totals for the nine schools were Milwaukee 1,850; Stevens Point 940; Eau Claire 836; Oshkosh 780; Superior 651; La Crosse 586; Whitewater 574; River Falls 439, and Platteville 436.
