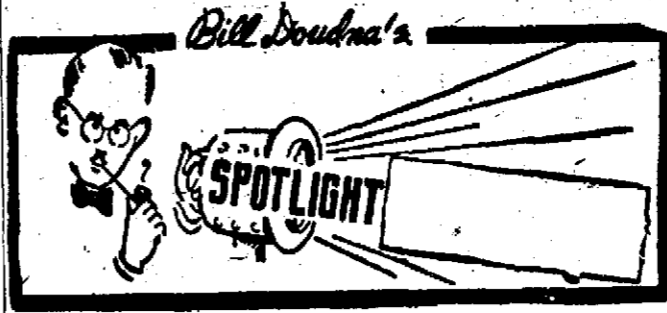

Remember "The Lady or the Tiger"? Luigi Pirandello's play, "Right You Are!", will recall it to you, for this play builds you up then leaves you for this play builds you up then leaves you...

Perhaps it isn't fair to tell so much about this production of Wisconsin Players (which opened Thursday night in the Wisconsin Union theater), but this fact is necessary in making a report.

This play, which the author calls a parable, is essentially a study of truth and of the shambles which gossip can make of it.

The scene is Italy, but it might as well be Terra Cotta, Vt., or Wilhelmsburg, Wis. The characters are gossips, their subjects, and a couple of men who honestly want to straighten things out, gossip or no gossip.

To the village come three people—a man, his wife, and the wife's mother. The gossips learn that, although the son-in-law visits the older woman, the latter never is permitted to see the wife at close range. This is born mystery.

With crafty writing, Pirandello logically brings the husband and mother-in-law before the gossips, separately, and each convinces them that the other is insane.

Then, in a scene of dramatic tension, he puts the two face-to-face before the rumormongers, with the result that nobody is sure which is sane.

At the suggestion of a man who stands, somewhat like an annotator, on the sidelines, the only person who can resolve the situation—the daughter—appears.

And all she does is to prove what the lone man has insisted all the time—that truth is ephemeral, that after all everyone will believe that which he most wants to believe.

This, in the telling, may sound like nonsense, but the campus actors gave it solidity and sense.

While there was a feeling of burlesquing some of the typed characters, the leading roles received honest treatment.

Ordean Ness, always a dependable performer, was relaxed, smooth, and convincing as the seeker of truth in the welter of gossip—seeking it while convinced all the time that nobody would find it satisfactory.

Daniel Frediani, who appeared only a few minutes, gave a sturdy characterization of the prefect, who also sought truth.

Marie Lezzi built up a convincing picture of the old lady, badgered by the gossips but maintaining a quiet dignity before their cruel onslaught. Kenneth Abrahamson was an intense son-in-law, another victim of rumor, by turns distraught and antagonistic, raging and winning sympathy.

Of the rest of the cast, Gay Brinckerhoff was the most credible, never carrying her characterization to extremes.

William Dawson as a pompous officeholder, John New and June Atlas as society gossips, Edith Dell as an antique ditto, and Ennio Rossi as a police investigator were little more than types.

Jonathan Curvin's direction kept the play moving, even in its worst first act, and constructed two high points of suspense with considerable craft.

"Right You Are!" will be repeated at 8 tonight and at 8 p. m. Saturday.
