Pontiff Opposes Regimentation of People by State

CASTEL GANDOLFO, Italy, Aug. 5. (AP) Pope Pius XII spoke out today against excesses of state control, declaring that neither the individual nor the family should be absorbed by the state.

He addressed in French 200 delegates from 10 nations who had attended the eighth International Congress of Administrative Sciences in Florence.

He declared that the true notion of the state is that of a moral organism, based on the moral order of the world, not an omnipotent oppression of all legitimate autonomy.

The pontiff said that there were certain rights of individuals and families which the state must always protect and can not violate or sacrifice to a pretended common good.

He described these as the right to honor and a good reputation, the right and the freedom to venerate the true God, the original right of parents over their children and their education.
