## TV Showing U. N. Meetings, Front Fighting on Korea BY C. E. BUTTERFIELD

NEW YORK. (AP) Television, lacking the flexibility of IN radio on a world-wide basis, nevertheless has been getting into the Korean picture. At the same time it has been doing things which radio would be unable to duplicate without a lot of tiring phraseology.

An example is covering meetings of the United Nations Security Council at Lake Success, making them available in their entirety to anyone within network range. These telecasts have run an hour or more.
