Joe is the familiar title of a 25,000-year-old mastodon which is the museum's prize item.

The curators and their assistants are busy taking Joe apart, cataloging and washing his bones and then dipping them in a preservative.

The 20-foot long, eight-foot high skeleton of the pre-historic elephant was found near Columbus by a farmer while digging.

WEST POINT, Va.—(UP)—Oldtimers along the Potomac river grow nostalgic when a battered ship passes with a load of pulpwood.

## \$509,000 Highway Contracts Signed

Contracts calling for \$509,000 worth of road improvements were signed by Gov. Rennebohm Monday.

Largest job was for a base course on 27.7 miles of State 13 south of Parkland in Douglas county. W. L. Kimmes, Superior, will do the work for \$293,509.

Dane county—Grading 7 miles of State 92 near Belleville, with Henry Raemisch, Middleton, for \$168,847.

Waushara county—Base course for 2.3 miles of State 164 North of Waushara, with R. T. Madden, Janesville, for \$96,475.

St. Croix county—Blacktop of 11 miles of county road for detour during work on State 35 between River Falls and Hudson, with St. Croix county for \$6,324.

Brown county—Improvements to road leading to state reformatory, with Holtz and Bass, Appleton, for \$4,854.

## State Jobless Claims Decline This Summer

Wisconsin jobless payment claims are taking a nosedive this summer, it was revealed Monday.

The unemployment compensation department said less than 9,500 persons filed claims during July and \$528,000 in payments were given out. The payments were \$226,400 below June and the claimants 28,500 fewer than in January, 1950.
