After a brief study of the hand, Pete won the first trick with the ace of hearts and immediately returned a low club from his hand. West naturally played low, and dummy won with the jack. When East could not follow suit, it was apparent that Pete had picked the safest possible line of play.

The continuation was very simple. Pete returned a club to his ace and led another club towards dummy's queen. West could take his king but could win no other club. Pete was sure to make four clubs, and the contract was therefore safe. If Pete had made the "normal" play of
