Lakewood Pastor Attends Church Meet in Chicago

Chaplain Wilford R. Hall and Mrs. Hall, accompanied by Rev. Roy L. Hazlett, associate minister, and Baron A. McLean, field worker, all of Lakewood Village Community Church, left Wednesday for Chicago, where they will attend the annual convention of the National Council of Community Churches on the campus of Lake Forest University, next week.

The item of greatest importance before the convention is merger of the national council and the biennial council of Community Churches, composed of Negro congregations, which will occur in the last session to be convened in Rockefeller Memorial Chapel on the campus of the University of Chicago. The group then will become interracial and thereafter will be known as the International Council of Community Churches.

As chairman of the Committee on Missions, Hall will have charge of the Thursday afternoon session to be addressed by the executive secretary of the International Missionary Council, soon to be merged into the new National Council of Churches of Christ in the U. S. A., which will replace the present Federal Council of Churches at the reorganization convention in Cleveland, Nov. 28 to Dec. 1.
