Karen Rebel Chief Killed in Battle
RANGOON, Burma, Aug. 15. (AP) The Rangoon radio has announced the killing in battle of the leading Karen rebel leader, Saw Ba U Gyi.
The radio said his body was found by government troops at a battle near Kawkaik, about 25 miles from the Burma-Thailand border.
Ba U Gyi had been information minister in the first postwar Burmese cabinet. He broke with the government when it refused to grant demands for Karen autonomy advanced by the Karen National Union, of which he was president.
